

History

Fire Station 46, Tapo Street

Station 46, was built in 1965 to cover an area of Simi Valley that was changing from agricultural to housing tracts and commercial developments. The station also provided for the first time a fire station on the north side of the railroad tracks and became the fourth fire station in the rapidly growing valley.

In 1995, the station was remodeled to add a dorm and work shop.

In 2013, S-46 underwent a major renovation. The office, day room, kitchen and bathroom were remodeled with the addition of a second bathroom. The engine room was reconfigured to two bays with larger openings for newer apparatus.

A fitness building was added in the rear of the property along with security fencing, new landscaping, signage and exterior upgrades.
